About our Speakers



Iona Holsted

Iona Holsted was appointed as Secretary for Education in 2016.

Prior to this, Iona was the Chief Review Officer and Chief Executive of the Education Review Office. Between 2007 and 2014, Iona held four senior management roles at the Ministry of Social Development, including Deputy Chief Executive - Students, Seniors and Integrity Services. In this role, she was responsible for services to seniors (superannuation payments), Studylink, and the integrity of the benefit system. Iona also spent six years as a Deputy Commissioner at the State Services Commission.

She started her career as a primary school teacher in Auckland, later becoming an advocate and researcher for the Public Service Association, and then as General Manager of a community-controlled primary health care organisation.

Iona has completed an executive leadership programme at the INSEAD Business School, and studied strategic leadership at Oxford University. She has been a mentor with the New Zealand Institute of Management since 2007, is a Member of the Executive Leadership Learning Network, and has served on Barnardos and YMCA Greater Wellington Boards.

lona has a Higher Diploma of Teaching from Victoria University of Wellington and trained as a teacher at Waikato College of Teacher Education.



Dr Kevin Shore

Dr Kevin Shore has been appointed the new Chief Executive Officer of the NZ Catholic Education Office, replacing Mr Paul Ferris QSM. Dr Shore will be Chief Executive of both NZCEO and the Association of Proprietors of Integrated Schools (APIS).

Dr Shore was Principal of St Peter's College, Palmerston North, and previously Principal of Cullinane College, Whanganui. He has a Doctorate of Education, a Masters in Educational Administration, a Post Graduate Diploma in Technology Education; and an NZ Civil Engineering Certificate (from a previous life!). His leadership has been in both state and state integrated schools over the past 25 years. Following his doctorate, he has been published in a number of professional journals as he focused on growing leadership in our schools.

Dr Shore has a strong commitment to te Tiriti o Waitangi. He has a genuine commitment to equity in education, and supports the practice of akonga and whānau (student and family) because of the way it aligns with the social justice focus of our school communities. He was fortunate to be accepted for a special equity-focused leadership course at Harvard University in 2015. More recently he has been a member of the Ministerial Joint Task Force for reducing the burden of administration and compliance in schools.

Miles joined ANZ in 2018 from the New Zealand Treasury, where he spent the previous four years working on fiscal strategy advice, marcoeconomic policy, and the Treasury's economic and tax forecasts.
